Low, lean and long, the custom bench partners with other unique elements in the room to make a big statement of style.

> WHY THIS ROOM WORKS

> > The bench's low backcushions don't block the mountain views and are designed with a pitch for comfort.

jute rug adds comfort and texture without a distracting pattern.

Requiring less depth than a table surrounded by chairs, this set-up allows more open space between it and the kitchen and living areas.

The 8-foot bench seat extends beyond the length of the 7-foot table, making access easier. An above average seat height accommodates children.

The horizontal chandelier visually extends the room's length.

Floor-to-ceiling draperies draw the eye upward and accentuate the 10-foot high ceilings.

The unmatched finishes of the reclaimed wood Trestle table, island, chairs and window casings prevent a predictable cookie-cutter look.
